



Sponsorship Form for Residence

For applications under the Family Category of Residence Policy



Notes for sponsors

This form is for sponsoring an applicant for New Zealand residence under the Family Category of New Zealand Government Residence policy. If you wish to register as a sponsor under the Refugee Family Support Category you must use the form *Registration for Refugee Family Support Category Sponsor (INZ 1094)*.

Children aged 16 years or younger are not eligible to be sponsors.

People aged 17-24 years will be acceptable as sponsors only where they can satisfy Immigration New Zealand (INZ) that they are able to meet the undertakings given in the sponsorship form.

Where this form refers to 'principal applicant' this means the person declared to be the principal applicant in the form *Residence Visa/Permit Application (INZ 1000)*. 'Applicant' means any person included in that residence application.

Completing this sponsorship form does not mean that the residence application of the person(s) you are sponsoring will be approved. Residence applicants must meet all the requirements of the policy they are applying under before they will be granted residence in New Zealand.

For full details of the policy which must be met by applicants sponsored for New Zealand residence, please read our *Self-Assessment Guide for Residence in New Zealand (INZ 1003)*.

Immigration Advisers Licensing Act 2007

Under the Immigration Advisers Licensing Act 2007, anyone giving immigration advice will have to be licensed (unless they are exempt). From 4 May 2009, all immigration advisers working in New Zealand must be licensed. From 4 May 2010, all immigration advisers, whether working onshore or offshore, must be licensed. It is an offence to provide immigration advice without holding a licence from these dates. If your immigration adviser is not licensed when they should be, INZ will return your sponsorship form.

- was a successful principal applicant under Family Category – Partnership Policy if:
 - less than five years elapsed since the date they were granted residence under Partnership Policy; or
 - they have previously supported or sponsored any other successful principal applicant under Partnership Policy.

Character requirements for partners supporting Partnership Policy applications

Partners who do not meet the character requirements in respect of a Partnership Policy application, unless granted a character waiver, are any person who has been convicted in the seven years prior to the date the application is made of any offence involving domestic violence or of a sexual nature.

What do I do now?

When you have completed this sponsorship form, give the completed form to the person(s) you wish to sponsor. The person(s) you are sponsoring should include the form with their application for residence.

About the information you provide

The information about you and your family requested on this form is being collected so INZ can determine whether you are eligible to sponsor a person for residence in New Zealand, and to ensure that you meet your sponsorship obligations should the person you are sponsoring be granted a permit to be in New Zealand.

The main recipient of this information is Immigration New Zealand of the Department of Labour, but it may also be shared with other Government agencies which are entitled to this information under applicable legislation.
