About the information you provide

Immigration New Zealand collects the information about you on this form to decide whether you are eligible for a permanent resident visa, a variation of travel conditions or a second or subsequent resident visa. We may also use the information to contact you for research purposes or to advise you on immigration matters.

Collecting the information is authorised by the Immigration Act 2009 and the Immigration Regulations made under that Act. You do not have to provide the information, but if you do not we are likely to decline your application.

The information we collect may also be used to determine whether you are allowed to board a flight to New Zealand. We will not share your personal information with airline check-in agents; however, we will send a boarding message to the airline check-in agent based on the information you have provided in this form.

Immigration New Zealand may also share the information you have provided with other government agencies that are entitled to it by law, or with other agencies (as you have agreed in the declaration or as may otherwise be permitted or required by New Zealand law). In respect only of applicants who state that they hold a current Australian Permanent Residence Visa or a current Australian Resident Return Visa, this information may also be shared with the issuing authority, in order to confirm that statement.

You are able to ask for the information we hold about you and ask to have any of it corrected if you think it is necessary. The address of Immigration New Zealand is PO Box 1473, Wellington 6140, New Zealand. This is not where your application should be sent.

It is an offence to employ a person who is not entitled to work in New Zealand. One way for employers to avoid committing this offence is to check a person's entitlement to work with Immigration New Zealand's online VisaView system. VisaView is authorised by legislation.
